PARKSIDE PLAN COMMUNITY "POP-UP" EVENT #1 SUMMARY

Saturday, October 24, 2015 | 10:00 A.M. – 1:00 P.M. Old County Rd, Brisbane, CA 94703

On October 24, 2015, the City of Brisbane hosted an interactive community "pop-up" event to gather community input on the future of the Parkside area. The pop-up event was designed as a fun, community-oriented, and family-friendly experience that also helped to raise awareness of the current planning process. To host the event, a section of Old County Road was closed to traffic and turned into a temporary plaza including three potential new street layouts, planning education and feedback opportunities, food, entertainment, and activities for kids.

Over 200 community members participated in the event, where they also enjoyed coffee donated by MadHouse Coffee, food from Melissa's Taqueria, live music by a local artist, a pirate magician, story time courtesy of the Brisbane Library, an antique fire truck from Brisbane's Fire Department, face painting and drawing.

I. Goals of the Pop-Up Event

The primary goal of the pop-up event was to collect broad public input on what the community would like to see in Parkside area in the future. By locating the event on a normally auto-oriented access road in the project area, event participants were able to experience and envision potential changes within their community as they looked at the actual sites where those changes could happen. The Plan Team designed the event with live music, food and an alternative street alignment along Old County Road to attract community members who might not come to a traditional planning workshop.

II. Outreach Methods

A robust community outreach effort was conducted to publicize the pop-up event including e-blasts, targeted flyer distribution and outreach to key partners including community-based organizations, established civic groups, schools, and local businesses.

III. Features and Activities of the Pop-Up Event

The pop-up event gathered the community's input on:

- Bike facilities and biking in Brisbane
- Preferred building types, uses and styles
- The Community Park and recreation facilities
- Land use priorities
- Community priorities and desires for retail and commercial uses
- Healthy community priorities
- Gateways to Brisbane and
- Favorite places in Brisbane.

The responses from the attendees were recorded on interactive outreach boards and have been summarized in Section IV.

In addition to the interactive boards, activities at the pop-up event included:

- Realignment of Old County Road including bike lanes, parking and a cycle track that participants could ride bikes on
- A performance by children's entertainer Captain Jack Spare-Ribs
- Outdoor seating for eating and visiting
- Coffee from MadHouse Coffee
- Tacos from Melissa's Taqueria
- Music by a local artist Johnny Villar
- Interactive art for children
- Face painting
- Storytelling
- Vintage fire engine

IV. Summary of Interactive Boards

Summarized below are the comments of the interactive outreach boards.

Come ride a bike.

This station encouraged participants to ride bikes in the temporary bike lanes, provide feedback on the potential street layouts, and offer information about biking in Brisbane. The community generally supported bike lanes along Old County and elsewhere in Brisbane. Safety and bike connections within and beyond Brisbane were the most important issues for the pop up attendees.

The most frequent comments include:

- Yes to bike lanes
- Bikes and cars should be separated
- Install bike racks at the park
- Create bike connections to Bay Trail
- Implement facilities for bike commuters
- In response to the realigned Old County Rd The bike lanes on either side of the street were preferred, though there was also support for the two-way cycle track.
- Improve the intersection at Old County Rd and Bayshore

What do you like about Brisbane Village, and what might you want to change?

This board invited participants to provide input on the Brisbane Village Shopping Center. The community agreed that enhancing Brisbane Village would benefit the entire community and may provide opportunities for necessary services such as a grocery store or pharmacy to move into Brisbane.

The most frequent comments include:

- Brisbane needs more locally-owned stores
- Brisbane Village needs an aesthetic face lift
- Desired uses: grocery store, higher quality restaurants, pharmacy, coffee shop, transit hub or event space
- Existing restaurants are well liked, though the community would benefit from higher end options.

What building types and styles do you think are most appropriate for the plan area? Put a green sticker in the dashed box next to your three favorites, and a red sticker next to your least favorite.

This board gave community members the opportunity to express their own opinions on the most appropriate building types for Brisbane. It featured pictures of buildings in a variety of styles from one to five stories high. The community preferred small-scale buildings that are aesthetically unique to Brisbane and provide some necessary service or accommodation. Large-scale buildings were heavily opposed and the community commented that large buildings would not fit within the existing context.

The most frequent comments include:

- Brisbane needs unique architecture
- Integrate buildings that both aesthetically and socially enhance the community
- Create housing that provides a high quality of life for inhabitants

Top three favorites:

- Two story mixed use (Brick building)
- Three story residential/mixed use
- Two story mixed use (Traditional Stucco)

Three least favorite:

- Five story mixed use
- Four- five story mixed use
- Three story residential (This may have related to building style)

What building uses do you think are most appropriate for the plan area? Put a green sticker in the dashed box next to your three favorites, and a red sticker next to your three least favorites.

This board provided the opportunity for Brisbane residents to think about the types of building uses they would like to see in Brisbane. The pop up attendees supported the idea of additional retail space in the community provided the retail supports necessary services such as a grocery store, pharmacy or restaurant.

The most frequent comments include:

- Brisbane needs more dining options
- A grocery store is in high-demand
- How do you ensure new storefronts won't be left empty?

Top three favorites:

- Recreation/Park (some land uses were included in this poster)
- Grocery Market
- Restaurant

Three least favorite:

- Light industrial
- Apartments/condos
- Office

Please tell us about yourself

Community members placed a red dot where they live and a yellow dot where their favorite spot is located. Pop up attendees came from all over Brisbane, including the residential areas off of Visitation and the Ridge development. When asked to denote their favorite place in Brisbane, many folks noted the park and San Bruno Mountain.



What are the most important elements of a healthy community to you?

This board gave community members the opportunity to express their thoughts on what contributes to a healthy community. Many pop up attendees saw opportunities to make their community a healthier place for existing and future residents. Creating an environment that fosters an active, clean and socially and environmentally conscious community was described as essential to Brisbane's future success.

The most frequent comments include:

- Access to open space and recreation
- Complete neighborhood necessary services in close proximity to residential areas
- Access to public transportation
- Safe options for alternative transportation like walking and biking
- Green building practices
- Clean air- reduced pollution
- Art in public spaces
- Well-maintained parks and outdoor gathering spaces
- Alternative energy
- Small independently-owned stores
- Safe neighborhoods
- A healthy and viable business district that serves Brisbane and surrounding communities

The park is a great place. How do you use the park? What would make it better?

Brisbane's Community Park is an extremely valuable amenity and seen as a focal point for the community of Brisbane. Opportunities for improvement suggested by the popup attendees included additional programming to engage a range of ages, abilities and interests.

The most frequent comments include:

- Don't change it
- Add programming concerts, movies, parties, festivals, snack bar, farmers market and planned sports
- Additional recreation facilities fitness area, trampoline, rock wall, volleyball
- More shade structures and trees

This building and blank wall aren't a great gateway element for the city. How would you like to see this site transformed?

The "I wish this was" board was positioned in front of the rear blank wall of an existing office and warehouse building along Old County Rd. The board provided the opportunity for the community to think about enhancing the existing entrances into Brisbane. The responses gathered from the interactive board ranged from short-term interventions like a mural to longer-range, revenue- generating land use changes such as a tech firm or restaurant.

Comments included:

- Mural (very popular)
- Grocery store
- Green space, living wall
- Mixed-Use Building
- Tech company
- Outdoor café/restaurant

IV. Next Steps

The Pop-Up Event raised awareness about the Parkside Area Plan, while allowing residents to experience first-hand potential changes to their street and public spaces. Using the information gathered at the Pop up Event, the Plan Team will develop a series of alternative plans which the community will weigh in on during the next community workshop in late January 2016.
