## A Proclamation of the City of Brisbane Recognizing

## West Nile Virus and Mosquito and Vector Control Awareness Week

June 26th to July 2nd, 2016

WHEREAS, mosquito- and vector-borne diseases continue to cause illness and death in California, including 737 illnesses and 45 deaths from West Nile virus in 2015; and

WHEREAS, the presence of invasive Aedes mosquitoes poses new public health threats in San Mateo County due to the potential of these mosquitoes to transmit diseases such as Zika; dengue, and chikungunya viruses and

WHEREAS, mosquito- and vector-borne diseases are likely to create new challenges for San Mateo County and the state of California in 2016; and

WHEREAS, public awareness can lead to a reduction in mosquito and vector populations as well as a reduction in the risk of vector-borne diseases among the residents of San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, the San Mateo County Mosquito and Vector Control District's program is a science-based program of integrated control aimed at reducing mosquitoes and the diseases they transmit; and

WHEREAS, West Nile Virus and Mosquito and Vector Control Awareness Week will increase public awareness of the threat of West Nile virus and other mosquito- and vector-borne diseases and highlight the use of integrated vector management to reduce the risk to human health within this county

**Now, therefore, be it resolved** that **the City of Brisbane** hereby declares that the week of June  $26^{th}$  to July  $2^{nd}$  to be recognized as West Nile Virus and Mosquito and Vector Control Awareness Week.
