Brisbane May 4th, 2019 Community Conversation Individual Participant Input Sheets

21 participant input sheets were collected (out of about 33 attendees); not everyone answered every question.

Before the conversation – How people described their prior experience

Most attendees were quite knowledgeable about Brisbane and its land use initiatives. According to facilitator feedback form estimates, the number of people familiar with the Baylands outnumbered newly involved community members by a roughly 5 to 1 margin. Roughly two thirds of attendees at the May 4th meeting had previously attended the first conversation on March 21st.

Most attendees learned useful information and better understand the development process. The format of the meeting worked well for most attendees, an impression confirmed by facilitator feedback forms.

Individual Feedback Form Comments

Summary: Most attendees heard about the event via email or from the previous conversation. Community members thought people needed to know about (and tended to be concerned about) the timeline for the development process, the possibility of building a high school on part of the project site, the source of water for the project needs, the soil remediation process for the site, and the specifics of the affordable housing component (some respondents seemed unclear whether affordable housing was limited to low-income earners or was just discounted rent for high-income earners). Few suggestions came in on how to engage residents moving forward, with available replies suggesting engagement on Facebook and with local businesses. Attendees feedback on the meeting itself was positive towards the gallery walk, though sometimes was concerned that the walk was too brief and that the staff presentations were too long.

Who pays for the monitoring? Who guarantees a clean water supply for the proposed housing? Freshwater (not recycled toilet water) is not currently sufficient for the proposed housing so this proposed mix of fresh and recycled toilet water will have to be actively monitored to keep the supplies separate? Who pays for the monitoring?
