## **FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE**

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received a subgrant application for City of Brisbane, San Mateo County, CA. Pursuant to Executive Order (EO) 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance Grant Program (PA).

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice for DR-4683-CA was published September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), federal actions must be reviewed and evaluated for feasible alternatives and for social, economic, historic, environmental, legal, and safety considerations. EO 11988 and EO 11990 requires FEMA to consider alternatives and provide a public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. EO 12898 requires FEMA to provide the opportunity for public participation in the planning process and to consider potential impacts to minority and low-income populations. This notice may also fulfill requirements under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within a Special Flood Hazard Area. FEMA has determined the only practicable alternative is to fund cleaning and removal of debris. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements. There is a potential for the structure to be impacted by future flooding events due to its location within the A Flood Zone. The proposed work will not take place in wetlands per the United States Fish and Wildlife Service National Wetlands Inventory and will have little potential to impact or affect wetland values.

**Proposed Work and Purpose:** The buildup of sediment and debris in the stormwater drain system was a result of the severe storms. The City of Brisbane will utilize contracts to restore the drains back to pre-disaster condition and bring them back to full capacity by removing 1500

CY of mud and sediment from the 3800 LF section of the storm drain system. No Hazard Mitigation will be applied to the project as the impacted area is part of a larger system and it is not practicably feasible to mitigate the entire stormwater system

## **Project Alternatives:**

- (1) (No Action) This alternative would result in decreased capacity for stormwater flow in future events. If the service is not restored, then adverse economic and social impacts may occur and continued negative impacts may be experienced.
- (2) (Repair with Minimization) Minimization measures were not practicable due to increased costs.
- (3) (Relocation) Floodplain avoidance by relocating the structure is not a practicable alternative as it is part of a larger network system.
