

The City of Brisbane Condemns Racism

At the June 4, 2020 City Council meeting, City Councilmembers and Mayor O'Connell closed the meeting in memory of George Floyd, an African American man who was killed by police on May 25, 2020, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Earlier that day, the City put up memorial signs honoring George Floyd and countless others who lost their lives due to police brutality. This was the first time in Brisbane history that someone with no prior affiliation with Brisbane was remembered on the City signboards.

Earlier that week, Police Chief Lisa Macias also issued a personal statement (brisbaneca.org/police) that was shared widely with community members and both Councilmembers Cunningham and Conway addressed racial injustice in their Letters from Council (brisbaneca.org/citycouncil/page/letters-council), which the City has been sending out each Sunday since mid-April.

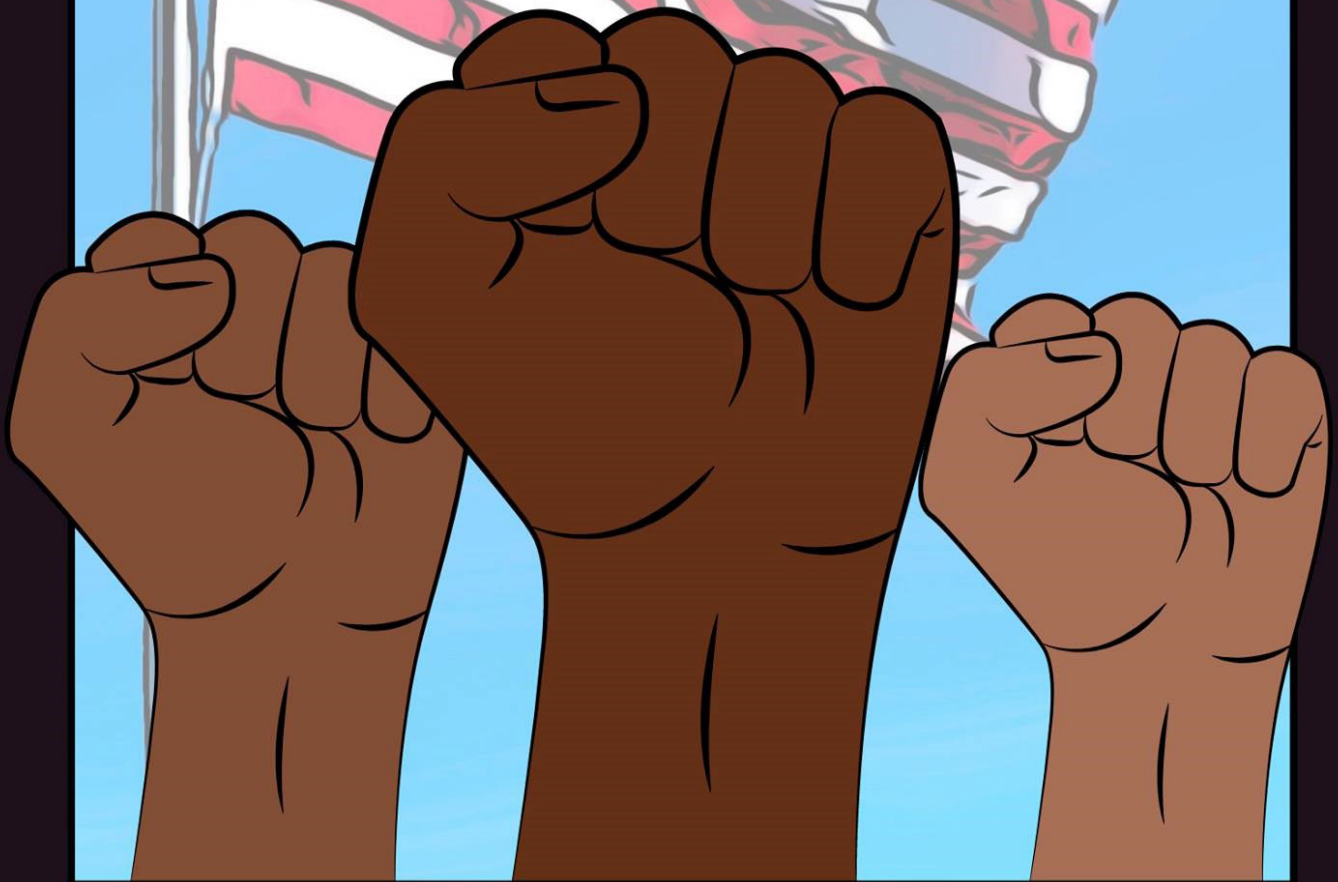

In response to Floyd's death, protests calling an end to police brutality and racial discrimination quickly spread across the country and abroad. On June 6, 2020, a group of local Brisbane residents also wanted to speak out against Floyd's death and organized a vigil in the Brisbane Community Park. Over 150 residents peacefully gathered to honor George Floyd and stand for justice, not just for this generation but for our future children. On June 18th, the City Council adopted a Resolution affirming the City's commitment to stand in solidarity with the Black community and condemn racism. Read it below:

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-47
A RESOLUTION OF THE BRISBANE CITY COUNCIL AFFIRMING THE CITY'S COMMITMENT TO STAND IN SOLIDARITY WITH THE BLACK COMMUNITY AND CONDEMN RACISM

WHEREAS, our country is mourning the senseless killing of George Floyd that occurred in Minneapolis on May 25, 2020. The actions and inactions of the police officers involved were deplorable, horrific, and unacceptable; and

WHEREAS, the most basic form of injustice and inequity occurs when a group of people feels their safety is placed into jeopardy by the very people entrusted with ensuring their safety; and

WHEREAS, police brutality and racism against the Black community has been persistent in our larger society, with the unrest regarding racial injustice, particularly towards the Black community, building up for decades; and

Their lives mattered and black lives matter; and

WHEREAS, it is important that the City take the lead, speak out against racial injustices, and stand in solidarity with Black communities across the country; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brisbane is a diverse and multiracial community that supports positive relationships and mutual respect in order to build healthy and safe neighborhoods; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Brisbane does hereby affirm its commitment to stand in solidarity with the Black community, and resolves as follows:

The City of Brisbane condemns racism in all forms and violence against the Black community by law enforcement in particular; and

The City of Brisbane does not tolerate discrimination, racial injustice, or police brutality; and The City of Brisbane will oppose any attempts to undermine the safety, security, and rights of members of our community and will work proactively

to ensure the rights and privileges of everyone in the City – regardless of race; and

The City of Brisbane will promote safety, a sense of security, and equal protection of constitutional and human rights, leading by example through equitable treatment of all by City officials and departments; and

The City of Brisbane encourages the community to stand together through peaceful exchange and discourse to enact change and move forward towards a future with more equity and inclusion in Brisbane, California, and our country.

Your library materials will be checked out and packaged in a paper bag that is labeled with your last name, first initial, and the last 4 digits of your telephone number and placed on a table at the entrance of the library, which will be located at the bottom of the walking ramp.

Should a line of people develop, please stand 6 ft. apart on the clearly marked spaces.

All library items are due back July 31st; if you'd like to return items, place them inside the travel wagon under the table.

Returns will be held for 3-5 days before being checked in from your library account.

Did you know that San Mateo County has 8 Core Service Agencies that work in close collaboration with the County's Human Services Agency to provide you and your family with basic emergency and support services to stabilize your living situation? Brisbane's Core Service Agency is the YMCA Community Resource Center, located in South San Francisco (1486 Huntington Ave.); there, they even offer free Brown Bag Groceries each Thursday after the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month in July, that's Thursday, July 16th and July 30th) from 12pm - 4pm. Please wear comfy shoes and bring your ID !

Although regular "safety net" services and financial aid for rent/utilities have certain eligibility requirements and restrictions, some of those have been loosened or dismantled during this time, especially if you can provide evidence showing your normal income levels have dropped due to COVID-19 and you are unable to sustain paying your rent and/or utilities. You must be a Brisbane resident, have a lease/letter with the owner of the property you rent, and be willing to provide some financial documents to the core service agency for processing.

Pedestrian or Walk Routes to Schools/Green Infrastructure Project: Currently Under Construction

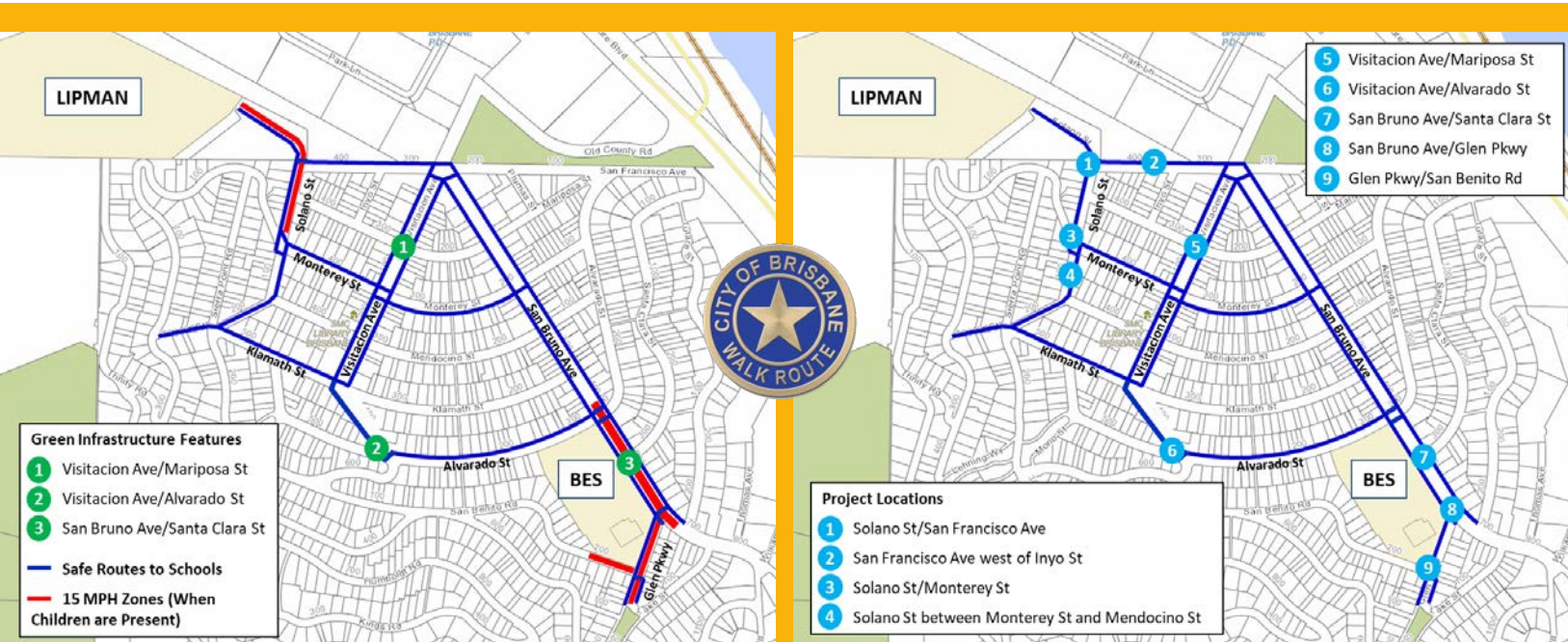
The City's contractor, Kingdom Pipelines Inc., began construction of the Pedestrian Routes to Schools/Green Infrastructure Project on Monday, June 8th. The project will last approximately two months, although construction at each individual location will be significantly shorter, as the work will be done in phases. Working hours will be from 8am – 5pm from Monday to Friday. There will be no road closures, but please be aware of traffic control measures in the vicinity. **If you live in the immediate vicinity of the locations shown on the second map below in light blue, please be aware of parking restrictions during various times between now and early August.**

The project will include street improvements along the Pedestrian or Walk Routes to Schools, which are designated sidewalk routes between Brisbane Elementary School and Lipman Middle School. At the three intersections shown below in green, the City of Brisbane will be installing green infrastructure (GI) bioretention basins, which capture and treat stormwater, next to the sidewalks and integrating them with curb ramp “bulb-outs.” Other improvements in some areas along the Walk Routes will include new sidewalk extensions, curb ramps, crosswalks, and striping modifications. On street segments near the schools, a new 15 MPH speed limit will be in effect while children are present.

Keep an eye out for the blue and gold-colored medallion markers (depicted below) which will be placed in the sidewalk to mark the Walk Routes in early August.

The project is partially funded by a grant from City/County Association of Governments of San Mateo County (C/CAG).

Jessica Tiatia Named Westmoor Teacher of the Year



In late May, we learned of the remarkable and praiseworthy achievement of Brisbane resident and teacher Jessica Tiatia, who was given the high distinction of Westmoor High School's 2020 Teacher of the Year! This honor was based in part to Jessica's partnership with San Bruno Mountain Watch, who is an active member of the San Mateo County Office of Education's Environmental Literacy Initiative. Jessica herself though designed the "solutionary" curriculum, which she learned more about after attending a SMCOE Environmental Learning Collaborative program offered last summer. The result? With support and guidance from Ariel and Carly of San Bruno Mountain Watch, and many months of hard work, Jessica worked alongside the students to research, acquire, and plant approximately 50 native plants on Westmoor's campus this past year with the goal to increase biodiversity on campus. We are so proud of Jessica for this achievement, and grateful that we have stellar organizations like San Bruno Mountain Watch right in our backyard to help connect school landscapes to the mountain!

NO FIREWORKS ALLOWED IN BRISBANE



We are sure that many residents have heard the fireworks/explosives going off throughout the night. Due to the low ambient noise level in Brisbane, the noise sounds louder than normal as it echoes throughout the City. The Brisbane Police Dept. has identified that these explosives are coming from the Visitacion Valley/Bayview District in San Francisco. This will very likely be the case on the 4th of July, with the noise probably even more pronounced. As a reminder, Fireworks of any kind, even safe and sane, are prohibited within the City of Brisbane. (The City of Pacifica is allowing fireworks, just not on the beach.) **If you see any fireworks going off within Brisbane's city limits, please call the Brisbane Police non-emergency line (415) 467-1212 to immediately report it and provide the officers a chance to catch the individuals in the act.** Thank you and be safe this Independence Day!

5/5 Fire at Eagles Hall Quickly Extinguished



Just after 1pm on May 5th, North County Fire Authority responded to a reported structure fire at the Eagles Hall, 185 Visitacion Ave., Brisbane. The standard structure fire response included 6 Fire Companies, 2 Battalion Chiefs and 1 Fire Investigator, with Engine 81 first to arrive quickly and finding a fire that was partially extinguished upon arrival, with the firefighters fully extinguishing the fire and completing an assessment of the building to ensure there wasn't any further fire spread. A building inspector with the City also responded that same afternoon. A fire cause and origin investigation determined that the fire was caused due to hot ash being placed into a trash receptacle that also contained some paper. North County Fire Authority reminds all residents and businesses to carefully handle and ensure any ashes are completely extinguished prior to disposal.

Water Main Replacement Project Summer Status Update



This project, which was about two-thirds complete on Kings Rd. when COVID-19 hit, resumed at the end of June. 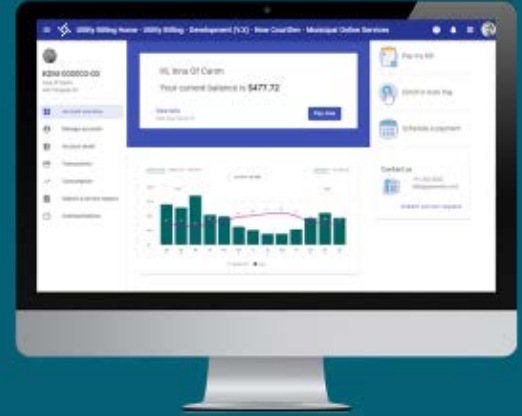

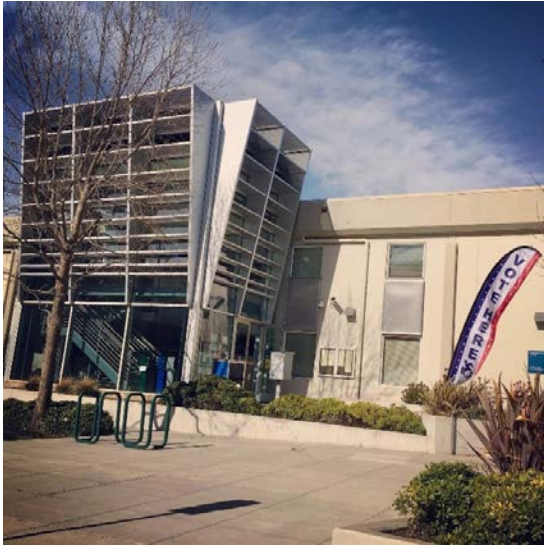


Farmer's Market Adds New Vendors

MARK YOUR CALENDARS: City Council Candidate Filing Period Begins July 13, 2020 & November 3, 2020 is Election Day



Mark your calendars – November 3, 2020 is Election Day. This election will be San Mateo County’s first Presidential General Election under the California Voter’s Choice Act. Under this act, all voters will be mailed a ballot. Voters will have the option of voting by mail (postage is pre-paid), returning their ballot at a Ballot Drop Box or a Vote Center, or voting in person at any Vote Center in the County. Brisbane City Hall will continue to be a 3-day Vote Center.

San Mateo County Elections Division will be taking the necessary precautions based on the COVID-19 prevention guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and the County Health Department to ensure this election is conducted as safely as possible.

Secondly, a Municipal Election will be held in the City of Brisbane for **Three (3) Members of the City Council with a term of four (4) years each.**

The candidate filing period begins July 13, 2020 and closes on August 7, 2020 at 1pm.

If nomination papers for an incumbent officer of the City are not filed by August 7th, the voters shall have until August 12th at 5pm to nominate candidates other than the person(s) who is/are the incumbents for that incumbent’s elective office.
