Former Mayor W. Clarke Conway returned to City Hall to administer the Oaths of Office.

At the December 9th City Council Meeting, we recognized outgoing Mayor Karen Cunningham for her year of stable leadership as Mayor and welcomed Coleen Mackin as Mayor and Cliff Lentz as Mayor Pro Tem! As the legislative branch of the government, the City Council makes final decisions on all major City matters. They adopt ordinances and resolutions necessary for efficient governmental operations, approve the budget, appoint the City Manager, City Attorney, and also the members of the City's Planning Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, Complete Streets Safety Committee, Open Space and Ecology Committee, Public Art Advisory Committee, and the City's newest committee, the Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Accountability (IDEA) Committee.

The City Council meets regularly on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month at 7:30pm on Zoom. Meetings can also be viewed on the City's YouTube channel and Comcast Ch. 27. 

New Vehicle for the Public Works Department

The Public Works Utility Department has received a new all-electric, zero emission meter service vehicle. This vehicle will primarily be used to replace a gas-powered vehicle for all tasks associated with water service meters, including reading water meters, replacing and repairing water meters, and water services. The goal is to reduce emissions, with expected savings of 1,800-2,700 pounds of CO2 per year, as well as improve efficiency of travel. The vehicle will be charged with 100% clean energy, thanks to Peninsula Clean Energy's ECO100 electricity used at all City facilities. Its use is another step towards electrification of the City's fleet as part of the Climate Action Plan.



NEWS: Housing Element Update



The update to the City’s Housing Element is underway. Last month, ECONorthwest facilitated a discussion on affordable housing at the Planning Commission’s December 16th meeting. ECONorthwest is currently working on Brisbane’s **Affordable Housing Strategic Plan**, which directly relates to the Housing Element policies and programs and will provide a valuable roadmap for investment in affordable housing in Brisbane. The Planning Commission was also introduced to

“**Balance Brisbane**”, an interactive mapping tool to gather community input on potential sites for residential zoning. If you haven’t yet, log on to Balance Brisbane at brisbaneca.org/balancebrisbane and let us know your thoughts on where Brisbane should provide zoning for future housing. Balance Brisbane will be open through January 14, 2022.

Also, on the topic of affordable housing, there’s a **Fair Housing Survey** on our Housing Element Update webpage, brisbaneca.org/housing-element-update, and it will be open through January 15th. It’s being offered through our partnership with the County-wide housing issues collaborative, 21 Elements, and the results will be used to help instruct our Housing Element programs.

Finally, for January events, the Planning Commission will be hosting its next **virtual Housing Element Update Workshop** during its regular meeting of **Thursday, January 27th, at 7:30pm**.
