Automated License Plate Readers and June 29th Virtual Meeting

Police departments throughout the County have seen an increase in crime. The Brisbane Police Department (BPD) has, as well. To that end, the Brisbane Police Department is considering adding an Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) program to the department as an additional tool to address this rise in crime. ALPRs would monitor vehicles entering and leaving the city, thereby assisting BPD in identifying suspect vehicles who may be coming in to our city to commit crime(s).



BPD has limited personnel to handle this growing level of criminal activity and having this new technology would assist the department in detecting, solving, preventing, and deterring this type of activity in Brisbane as they strive to fulfill their mission of providing excellent levels of service to the community and keeping us all safe.

ALPRs capture and store digital images of license plates, and use character recognition to identify and store the plate's characters. The system creates a searchable database which includes the license plate, the date and time of when the image was collected, the location the license plate image was taken. The strategic placement of these ALPRs around the City of Brisbane would be a force multiplier for BPD.

The Police Department will be holding a Virtual Community Engagement Meeting on Wednesday, June 29th at 6pm at https://doi.org/alpr-zoom to discuss ALPR technology with interested community members. Aaron Kierbel facilitates rhythm ice breakers, rhythms from around the world as well as creative movement and lots of laughter and fun. News on the 2023-2031 Housing Element Update

In April, the Planning Commission wrapped up its series of workshops on the Housing Element update with a review of the City's goals and policies related to maintaining and preserving existing housing, developing new housing to meet our Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA), and ensuring fair and protected access to housing for all households in Brisbane. This Housing Element cycle is one of the most technically challenging cycles yet, with a numerous new requirements from State law in terms of the Element's content and analysis. So, while Planning staff hoped to publish a draft in May, they now anticipate releasing the draft Housing Element for public review and comment in **mid-June** with a workshop, followed by a public hearing with the Planning Commission following in late June. Let's Move to Save a Child's Sight!

The annual Cure Coats' 5K Run/Walk raises money to fund research for a cure for Coats' Disease. Coats' Disease is a rare eye disease that causes leakage of the blood vessels behind the retina, resulting in swelling, retinal detachment, vision loss, blindness, and sometimes, even the loss of the eye. The majority of patients are diagnosed as children, and often too late for early intervention to prevent vision loss. While research has improved treatments, there is still no cure. Events like the Cure Coats' 5K are key to funding the breakthrough research so desperately needed.
