



2022 Municipal Election Information



We are a General Law city that holds our elections during the month of November in even-numbered years. We have five elected officers – five Council Members. Each seat has a term of four years. The Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem are appointed by the City Council for a one-year term in December.

2022 General Municipal Election

Offices to be Voted On: On June 16, 2022, the City of Brisbane City Council adopted Resolution 2022-48 calling for a General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 for the election of two (2) Council members for a term of four years each.

The filing period for nomination papers opened Monday, July 18, 2022. The last date and time for the submission of nomination papers is Friday, August 12, 2022 at 12pm.

Measures to be Voted On:

- *Shall the City of Brisbane's measure to fund city services/facilities, such as neighborhood police patrols, fire prevention services, urban wildfire protection, crime suppression/investigation, pothole/street repair, parks and other city facilities, and to support other city services, by levying a ½¢ Transaction and Use Tax, generating approximately \$2,000,000 annually until ended by voters, be adopted?*
- *To pay for general municipal expenses, shall an ordinance be adopted imposing on hotels and other places designed for overnight stays by guests a business license tax of \$2.50 per room for each day such room is rented, generating approximately \$250,000 annually until ended by the voters?*

Arguments for or against the above measures may be submitted in writing to the City Clerk's Office, 50 Park Place, Brisbane, California, for printing and distribution to the voters, pursuant to provisions of the California Elections Code, on or before 12pm on August 19, 2022. Rebuttals by authors of said arguments may be filed with the City Clerk's Office in like manner on or before 12pm on August 29, 2022.

Learn and Share Your Ideas about Housing Programs in Brisbane!



On July 28th, the Planning Commission hosted a workshop on policies and programs from the upcoming 2023-2031 Housing Element. Missed the virtual meeting? What is a Housing Element?

A Housing Element is the City's plan for meeting its housing needs over an eight-year planning period (2023-2031), including but not limited to:

- Supporting construction of new housing units by housing developers
- Preserving existing units
- Preventing residents from being displaced from their homes, and
- Making sure all residents are aware of their housing rights

What are Brisbane's Housing Needs?

The State of California has determined that the City must show in its Housing Element that it has the zoning capacity for at least 1,588 new housing units. Other housing needs include protecting vulnerable residents from displacement and preserving existing affordable housing.

What ideas and programs should Brisbane pursue to meet its housing needs?

Some ideas Brisbane is considering include:

- Studying areas where smaller homes could be built and helping homeowners build more second units or ADUs
- Providing education and training for landlords and tenants about federal housing vouchers and ways to prevent displacement
- Finding ways to help low and moderate income households use less water and energy
- Supporting transit use, rideshare or car rental services in new residential developments to reduce the number of parking spaces and reduce pollution from cars

Public Art Advisory Committee Seeks Consultant to Assist with Placing Art in the Community Park

The Public Art Advisory Committee is seeking a consultant to assist them with selecting an artist to create original art or art elements to be placed in the Community Park across from the Village Shopping Center. The consultant that's selected will work closely with the Committee and the public to determine the themes the community would want represented in this location and then find an artist who can translate these themes into a one-of-a-kind art piece. The funds used for this project are generated from the Public Arts Ordinance to place art throughout the community.

The Request for Proposals has been posted on the City's website at brisbaneca.org/rfps as well as on the California Arts Council's page arts.ca.gov, with submittals due back by August 31st at 5pm.



It's Time to Be "Foodware Aware"!

Did you know that one of the biggest contributors to plastic pollution is the foodware that holds your next to-go meal? To address the problem of plastic pollution and protect public health, the City of Brisbane adopted the Disposable Foodware Ordinance that will start being enforced on **October 1, 2022**.

The Ordinance requires restaurants and other food facilities (e.g., farmers' markets, food trucks, push carts, cafeterias, groceries, etc.) to eliminate disposable plastic foodware and replace it with compostable alternatives made from natural fiber such as paper, sugarcane, or bamboo. Reusable foodware items are also highly encouraged. Cups, bowls, take-out containers, utensils, and straws are just some of the common disposable foodware items that are impacted by the new Ordinance.

If you need utensils, condiment packets, napkins, or other small side items (a.k.a. accessories) when ordering food, especially takeout, please remember to ask for them. Restaurants and other food facilities can now only give out these accessories when the customer directly asks for them and/or at dispensers that dispense one item at a time. Additionally, accessories can only be given out as separate, individual items. Food operators at drive-throughs, however, are allowed to ask customers directly if they want accessories.

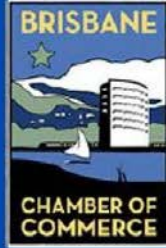

YOUR BUSINESS COULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT

The Brisbane City Council has \$38,000 left of federal relief funds to distribute to small businesses impacted by COVID-19. The Brisbane Chamber is assisting the City in distributing these grants. Funds will be evenly distributed among all qualified applicants.

Details

How to Apply: Fill out an application at grants.brisbanechamber.org. Applications will be available in English, Chinese, Spanish, and Tagalog

When: Applications are available starting Tuesday, July 19 at 9am. The portal will close August 5, 2022 at noon. Businesses will be notified if they have been selected to receive a grant by August 19, 2022.

Eligibility

- Be a Brisbane business with a valid business license from 2019-2022 **OR** a Brisbane business started in 2020 with business licenses from 2020-2022
- Provide a Profit and Loss Statement from 2019 and 2020 showing a 15% or more loss in revenue or profit from 2019-2020 **OR** a signed lease in a commercial district for new 2020 businesses (at-home businesses started in 2020 are ineligible)
- Must have been in operation prior to March 19, 2020 (new 2020 businesses are exempt), still be operational today, and remain operational once funds are distributed
- Give permission to the City of Brisbane and The Brisbane Chamber of Commerce to share with the public that their business received a grant
- Have no more than \$5,000,000 in gross receipts in 2019 (2020 businesses exempt)
- Provide a W-9 to the City
