This partnership enabled participants to experience henna artistry, dance performances such as Westmoor high school senior Lavanya's Indian classical dance, Kathak, an ancient art form she has been practicing for almost 8 years, youth and adult dance workshops with another Brisbane resident, Swetha, and delectable Indian cuisine provided by the City's IDEA Committee by way of revenues generated via the City's online merch store, brisbaneca.org/betsy!

In closing, "Diwali" means "festival of lights" – don't miss another Festival of Lights event, happening on Sunday, December 3rd from 5:30pm – 8pm!



City Manager Recruitment Update

In late October, the City Council selected a new recruitment firm, Teri Black and Company, LLC. The recruitment is expected to open in December and has a close date of January 21, 2024. City Manager Clay Holstine has served in this position for the past 25 years and is the longest-serving City Manager in the history of San Mateo County! In order for the transition to be as smooth as possible, CM Holstine will continue with the City on a contract basis through next spring. It is expected that his successor will start sometime in Spring 2024.



Brisbane Village Helping Hands Celebrates Achievements

When Carol "Karuna" Forest picked up a prescription at the Kaiser pharmacy in South San Francisco for Carol Pizarro, it was an ordinary request fulfilled by Brisbane Village Helping Hands, a volunteer nonprofit devoted to helping Brisbane seniors. But it was also a very important milestone, marking the 1,000th time the organization has helped a Brisbane senior in need.

For the small town of Brisbane, that's a remarkable feat, considering that BVHH was only launched in 2016 and a pandemic temporarily put BVHH volunteers on hold from being able to offer assistance during lockdown.

"I feel very proud of what we've built and what we've been able to accomplish," Nancy Colman, BVHH president, told volunteers during a pizza party at Mama Mia's to thank volunteers for their hard work." And I really appreciate being able to work with all of you!"



BVHH could not have done it alone: It's had strong support from the City of Brisbane and the Brisbane Lions Club, which have both offered monetary assistance. Private residents including Jamesanne Dunn have also been benefactors. Thanks to such support, the organization has been able to waive its annual dues since the beginning of the pandemic.

Unlike other village organizations, BVHH runs on a shoestring

budget with no paid staff; Board members check the phone line (donated by the City) daily for messages, and post the requests to the organization's vetted volunteers, who can "click" on a button to accept them. Requests might include transportation to doctor appointments, tech help, friendly visits, or running errands. Donations pay for insurance, the Ridescheduler App and website, and social events to build community. The mission of BVHH is to help senior citizens remain in their homes and live independently – and decrease isolation. BVHH has 55 members and 54 volunteers. Many are both members and volunteers.

"The Village has helped me with so many things including picking up medications, hanging my curtains, assisting me with my computer and helping when I was recuperating from surgery," said Penny O'Connor. "They are a great organization."

Congratulations to the Library's Summer Learning Challenge Scholarship Winner, Oliver Manyak-Pritsker!




