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NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the City of Brisbane Planning Commission on **Thursday, April 14, 2022, at 7:30 p.m., virtually via Zoom, videoconference broadcast on local Comcast channel 27 and the City's YouTube channel**, to consider the following matter:

APPLICATION NO.: Interim Use Permit 2021-UP-3 Modification

APPLICANT/OWNER: Eric Aronsohn, applicant; Oyster Point Properties Inc, owner

LOCATION: 600 Tunnel Avenue, the Baylands subarea between Tunnel Avenue and the CalTrain rail lines (Assessor's Parcel Numbers 005-340-040 & 005-350-080)

ZONING: C-1 Commercial Mixed Use (Baylands)

REQUEST: Interim Use Permit Modification to allow the continued staging of up to 90 Google commuter buses on an approximately 3 acre, graded and fenced site, with changes to the proposed operations schedule.

Alternatively, the Planning Commission will consider revocation of the above referenced interim use permit, which was granted on November 16, 2021.

ENVIRONMENTAL STATUS: Categorical Exemption per State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 – this project falls within a class of projects which the State has determined not to have a significant effect on the environment. The exceptions to this categorical exemption referenced in Section 15300.2 of the CEQA Guidelines do not apply.

This meeting will be conducted exclusively via videoconferencing in compliance with California Assembly Bill No. 361 effective September 16, 2021. The purpose of this virtual public meeting is to provide the safest environment for staff, Planning Commissioners, and the public while ensuring public participation.
