Be On the Look-Out – Changes to Your Water Bill Beginning February 2020

Senate Bill 998, which went into effect January 1, 2020, mandates certain changes to our water bills and processes for residential customers. These changes are designed to make the process more accessible to everyone in the community by increasing transparency about the Discontinuation for Non-Payment process as well as our appeals and payment arrangement processes. The new legislation also provides opportunities for non-English speaking customers to receive these policies in their primary language.

Most of the changes are centered around Disconnection Notices, which are sent to customers who have not paid their bill approximately 45 days after it has been issued, but there will be some wording changes on your regular water bill and any 1st late notices as well.

We wanted to provide this heads up now; look for more details in the next bill, which will be sent out at the end of this month!



Friends of the Brisbane Library Almost at their Fundraising Goal



For the New Brisbane Library





Having a babysitter can give you peace of mind. It allows you to leave your child with someone you trust. Be sure your babysitter knows about fire safety. Be sure your babysitter knows what to do if there is a fire.

Show the babysitter your home escape plan and make sure the babysitter understands:

-))) two ways out of every room.
-))) where the outdoor meeting place is located.
-))) the fire department or emergency phone number.
-))) how to unlock all doors and windows.

If you allow your babysitter to cook, make sure the babysitter:

-))) keeps your child at least 3 feet away from the stove.
-))) keeps your child at least 3 feet away from the microwave oven.
-))) never leaves the room while cooking.
-))) keeps anything that can catch fire away from the stovetop.
-))) keeps pets off surfaces and countertops.

If the smoke alarm sounds make sure your babysitter knows to:

-))) get out of the home quickly with your child to safety.
-))) use the second way out if smoke is in the way.
-))) get low and go under the smoke to the exit if an escape must be made through smoke.

Store matches and lighters out of your child's reach. Candles should not be used by your babysitter.

Make sure your babysitter keeps a 3-foot "kid-free zone" around space heaters.

REVIEWBER

Always leave the phone number where you can be reached. Cell phones make this easy. Be sure the babysitter knows the address of the home.



Many places offer babysitter classes. These are online and in the classroom. Some schools and hospitals give training. Classes teach how to care for children. They also teach first aid. They teach CPR. What to do in an emergency is also taught.

On January 8th, no left turns from San Bruno onto Bayshore, except shuttles heading north, went into effect. This was a Council-approved decision to improve motorists' safety at this intersection, as well as to increase efficiencies during commute hours. Thank you for adhering to the new traffic regulation, which for some, meant needing to modify their route. This included taking San Bruno to Old County Rd., in order to make a safer left turn at the Old County @ Bayshore signalized intersection.

In the spring of 2020, signs will also be installed on Bayshore @ San Bruno to prohibit U-turns in both the northbound and southbound directions. Thank you for your cooperation with these modified traffic laws, whose intent and goal is to make this intersection safer and more efficient.
