

Longer days, more frequent sunshine and the winds consistent from the North-Northwest. These kinds of conditions beg for us to get off the dock and enjoy what we own—our boats! By the time this newsletter goes out, I will have just returned from spending some time in Cabo San Lucas and sailing around the tip of the Baja Peninsula, fishing, sunbathing, swimming and simply letting my hair down. It's truly amazing just how much the water will calm your soul and bring you back to center.

While we may not always have the time or opportunity to run South to go boating, the Bay offers some wonderful sailing and boating in any direction you head from our entrance channel. Not long ago, I had the opportunity to anchor in Clipper Cove at Treasure Island, which offers some wonderful views of the Bay Bridge lit up at night (see next page), and then the skyline of the City in the opposite direction. The cove is fairly protected from the predominant wind, however it can be a bit shallow depending on the tide. Ayala Cove at Angel Island is another beautiful spot to consider, especially if you're not wanting to anchor and like the security of a mooring ball. You also have the opportunity to go ashore during the day and hike the ridge trail (about a 2.5 mile hike), or around the perimeter of the island (about a 5 mile walk). If you've explored all the bay has to offer, the Delta is not that far away and a great place to visit during the summer. If you head down the San Joaquin River, it offers many spots to hide out from the breeze in a secluded little anchorage while dipping your toes in the water to stay cool from the valley heat.

Reeling back to items closer to home:

- * Cardboard—please do not place cardboard in the trash cans; it takes up a lot of space and does not belong in the general refuse cans. Please walk the cardboard to the cardboard dumpsters within the enclosure at the head of Dock 1, or the midlevel enclosure in the parking lot above Dock 4. Please break down boxes or other large containers before placing in the dumpster.
- * Recycling: the blue rolling recycle bins, at each garbage enclosure, are clearly labeled on the lid of what is allowed to go inside them. Please refer to those labels before dumping anything inside. Trash and the other crossed out items do not go in the blue or green recycle bins at all. Please help us in keeping the proper items within the proper containers.
- Dock boxes: please ensure you either put a piece of wire or a lock in the hasp that will keep the lids closed in wind events. If the lid gets removed by a wind event, they are not replaceable. Please help us with keeping the lids secured properly. If you need a piece of wire for your dock box, we can provide you with some at the marina office.
- * Dock carts: please make sure they are clean and usable for the next person by removing all your garbage and/or wiping them out if you left residue in the bottom.


