Slipping over to marina items:

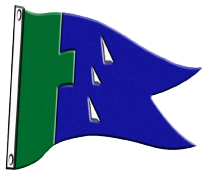
- ◆ A friendly reminder, face masks are **required** when entering our office; please make sure you are wearing yours properly before entering. Your health, and ours, is very important to us, and we are doing what we can to help slow the spread of COVID-19.
- ◆ We have not made it fully through the windy season, and we are seeing many boats with improperly sized, or poorly maintained dock lines on their boats. Please take a moment to come down and check on your boat and dock lines; many have stretched with the recent howlers we have had!
- ◆ With the boats moving around in the wind, it has a tendency to pull electrical cords into the water. Please make sure your cords are properly secured to your vessel, and when ran on the dock, make sure they are not a tripping hazard.
- ◆ Thank you for being patient, as we have recently received our new gate closers and are working on getting them installed as quickly as possible. Until we reach your gate, please continue to make sure and close the gate when entering and leaving the dock.
- ◆ Maintenance work on your boat is limited to items that do not contaminate the water, dock or other vessels around you. Spray painting of any kind, is strictly prohibited within the marina, and must be done at a proper yard facility.
- ◆ The Sierra Point Parkway road closure is coming to an end—for now. The developer is estimating to have the road back open by close of business on Friday, August 7, 2020. YAY!!
