Now, heeling over toward marina items:

- ◆ With multiple hellacious wind events recently, we have seen many dock lines that have either stretched, frayed or broke. Many fenders are also in need of being aired up, or replaced. Please make it a point to check your boat frequently as the weather is ever changing and requires your vigilance in monitoring all items aboard.
- ◆ Household extension cords are not a satisfactory method of supplying power to your vessel. Extension cords in use need to be replaced with a UL Marine listed 30A or 50A power cord, and plugged in appropriately to the power box at your slip. In addition, please route the cord along the dock finger so it’s not a trip hazard to you, the adjacent boater or our maintenance team working on the docks.
- ◆ A friendly reminder regarding your black water waste: if it hasn’t gone through your body, please do not put it in your holding tank or porta-potty to be pumped out. Foreign objects cause clogs, unnecessary down time and costly repairs.
- ◆ Please make sure all your contact information, including email, phone and mailing address, is up to date with our office.

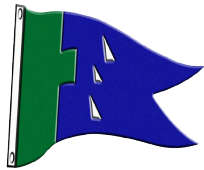
