Happy New Year

Yay—we're starting 2022! What better way to send off an old year, than celebrating with family and friends to ring in the new. And with a new year, it generally brings some ideas to mind of how we would like to change or enhance our lives in the year ahead. What kind of New Years Resolution's did you make? A couple of mine are to spend more time with family and friends (now that we're hopefully able to), and go boating more. Against the Wind is itching to break away from the dock and head to open water for some relaxing hours on the bay.

The start of a new year however, generally means we are in the middle of winter too, which presents its own set of challenges. Cold and wet weather usually means closed ports or hatches aboard, and that leads to moisture and condensation build-up, that if not dealt with in a timely fashion, leads to mold and other "fun" clean-up measures. So here are a few inexpensive products to help combat those pesky moisture issues, that you can find at most marine suppliers:

- * Davis Instruments Air-Dryer 1000 Dryer. It looks like a UFO you can set on the table, or on the floor in the galley. As it gently warms the air, the warm air disperses through the top vents and draws in the cool damp air from below, using natural convection to circulate the air and effectively minimizing the moisture aboard.
- * GoldenRod Dehumidifier is great for tighter spots aboard. It emits a low heat, and can keep enclosed spaces from building up moisture. You may see these at some local suppliers for gun safes, but they work great aboard the boat too.
- * Star Brite No Damp Moisture Absorber is a non-electrical method (great for smaller boats with no AC power aboard), but it does require some maintenance. Pellets are used to attract the moisture, and it requires the tub to be emptied of the water, along with replacing the pellets on regular intervals. However, it is a great excuse to get out of the house to come and check on the boat.

Tacking over to some housekeeping items:

- * NO WAKE in the harbor—slow to NO WAKE before reaching our sea wall when entering, and make sure you are not creating a wake until you have fully cleared our sea wall on departure. Please refer to the image on page 2 for designation of the Marina's NO WAKE zone.
- * Please make sure your power cord is long enough to route safely along the dock finger or your boat deck so it does not pull on the receptacle aboard your boat, or on the dock box. For additional safety, do not allow the cord to drape through the water, or become wedged between the boat and dock.
- * Winds from the North and East will cause the dock gates to stay open—please take a moment after walking through the gates to make sure they close fully. We need your help in keeping the marina safe and secure for all of you to enjoy.
- * Wind and water are a perfect combo for making dock lines stretch. Take a moment to come and check on your boat and ensure it's properly tied to the dock.



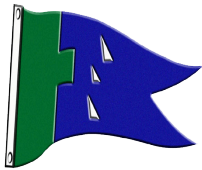
We hope the New Year starts off right, and treats you, your family and friends well!
