Happy New Year!

As they say, time flies when you're having fun! And here we go with saying Goodbye 2022, Hello 2023! Of course with a new year, many think it's time to come up with a plan to make a "new you". If you're into making resolutions, what new or adventurous thoughts did you come up with? I didn't go with anything crazy; I just want to get out and go sailing and boating more this year. The water has been calling, and there's just something about being out on it that makes the day better!

However, we all have to remember that we're still in winter, and the weather can change quickly on the water. Lately we have been seeing a number of small craft and gale force wind warnings. For additional safety, bring along a couple extra layers of clothing in case the weather goes south and you're stuck on the water a little longer than anticipated.

Dipping our toes into some helpful safety tips and other reminders:

- * Safety tip #1: Please keep your power cords ran along the deck of your boat, and suspended safely from the bow, or stern, to the dock box. Power cords that drape through the water can cause shock potential and electrolysis in the marina through a compromised outer jacket of the cord. Household cords are not marine rated and are not allowed for use as a power source to your vessel.
- * Safety tip #2: Running your boat, whether it is warm or cold outside, creates carbon monoxide. Carbon monoxide may remain at toxic levels aboard a vessel, even if the engine is shut off. For safety, install a marine rated CO monitor aboard any vessel with a combustion engine or other combustible fuel source used for cooking or heating.
- * Safety tip #3: With cold temperatures dipping into the 30's at night, there may be occasional frost/ice present on the docks and ramps. Please be aware of any slippery conditions that may exist, and take precaution when walking the docks or traversing the ramp.
- Pets: All dogs are to be on a leash, held and controlled by their owner at all times when off the boat, on the dock or walking along the Bay Trail. Do not allow your dogs or cats to roam our docks. We want our docks to remain clean and free of pet waste.
- * Reminder: Dock carts are a limited commodity provided for use by all our boaters. Please be courteous by promptly returning the cart to the head of the dock for others to use. Additionally, please do not leave dock carts in the parking lot; they are costly to replace.
- * **Reminder:** NO WAKE applies to everywhere inside the marina. Please be at No Wake speed before getting to the sea wall when entering. Your vessel's wake follows you into the marina and can cause damage.
- Update: A client recently reported Blue Line Transfer, part of SSF Scavenger, will take up to 10gal (limit/day) of anti-freeze at no charge. For those of you with closed cooling systems looking to replace the coolant within the heat exchanger and engine, be sure to check with them. 
