Ripples, wakes and waves—they can happen all in a day, here in the Bay!

Half the year has already passed, and it's not slowing down. Much like the tide, we are now ebbing towards the end of 2020, and BOY has it been a year so far!

As you may have seen or read on June 17, 2020 the San Mateo County Health Officer's new health order, the Shelter in Place has been rescinded. While we may no longer have a Shelter in Place, we have definitely not made it through the other side of this ordeal yet. We surely do not want to see an up-tick in COVID-19 cases or hospitalizations, so please continue to be safe and respect the social distancing guidelines.

Flowing over to marina happenings:

- ♦ Note: the garbage cans at the head of each dock, and dumpsters at dock 1 and 4, are for your basic garbage use. They are NOT for project materials from your boat, or from your household; those need to be disposed of legally at a local dump or transfer station. Should you need help locating a facility, please stop by our office and someone will happily point you in the right direction.
- ♦ Vessel speed within the marina: NO WAKE. Your vessel should not be producing any wake within the marina seawalls, and you should be at a "No Wake" speed by the time you are entering the mouth of the harbor. Please note, you are responsible for any damage caused by your wake to the docks and/or any vessels.
- Reminder: Please check your dock lines for any fraying or breaks. With a good portion of the windy season ahead of us, your dock lines are a crucial factor in making sure your vessel stays properly secured within its slip.
- ♦ If you have been along the Bay Trail, you will notice the outdoor gym equipment has been opened back up. However, please make sure to follow San Mateo County guidelines for social distancing and washing your hands after use.
- ♦ We have also installed "Slow Down" signage on the Bay Trail along the marina. The Trail is a shared use path for walkers, joggers and bicyclists alike. If you are on a bicycle, please yield to pedestrians, and slow down going around blind corners. We want everyone to stay safe, and enjoy the path together!


