And even though my kids are still in distance learning, they are just as ecstatic to turn off their tablets and get outdoors for some recreational activities. I foresee some camping, or dipping toes in the water at a beach in the near future!

Until that time of playing in the hills, or on a beach comes along, let's shift gears and head over to some marina items ~

- ◆ When I'm walking the docks, I see there are many boats that have been sitting idle for a little while, and sadly some much longer than that. One of the things we like to pride ourselves on is a marina that is clean and family friendly. Part of this comes with help from you, our clients, making sure to keep your boat(s) clean. Take a moment to show your boat some love, come on down and hose her off, or schedule a boat washer to get your vessel spruced up. Dock appeal is just as important as curb appeal in a neighborhood.
- ◆ There is no fishing or fish cleaning within the marina. Fish cleaning can be done outside of the marina seawalls, or at the public fishing pier at the North end of the marina. Any guts or other unwanted fish parts are to be taken home, and not to be dumped in the garbage or dumpsters at the marina. Decaying fish are smelly, and attract birds and other rodents. Please help us in keeping our marina clean and enjoyable for everyone.
- ◆ The designated loading zone at the head of dock 5 is a 20 minute parking spot specifically for loading or unloading your vehicle. Vehicles utilizing the loading zone for longer term/day parking may be subject to towing at the vehicle owner's expense. Please be courteous to the other boaters needing to load or unload their vehicles, and park in designated parking stall for marina clients.
- ◆ With unrelenting wind lately, if you decide to take your boat out earlier in the day, and upon returning it's too windy to safely dock in your slip, tying up to the guest dock for the night is a possible option. If you would like to take advantage of this opportunity, please request space from the office ahead of time if possible. If it's after hours, check for available space to land safely, and then notify the office in the morning. It's better than having an incident and ruining what would otherwise have been a great outing!
- ◆ Remember, if it hasn't gone through your body, don't put it in your toilet. The pump out machine on Dock 1 is for human waste only. Clogs and/or damage created by foreign objects causes unnecessary downtime and costly repairs to the pump out machine.

Lastly, stop by the Swap Meet section, and see what you can't live without! If you have something cluttering up your boat you no longer need, visit page 3 for details on how you can submit your item for next month's newsletter. 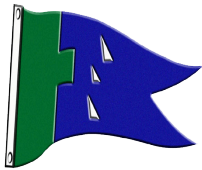
For now, reef the sail & pull in the lines, or throttle up and head against the wind ~ Either way you float, have a safe and fun boating adventure!
