

April showers supposedly bring May flowers, but it has to stop raining long enough for the flowers to bloom. While we wait for that sunshine and warmer weather, there's a bunch of other things to look forward to in the month of May. Just to name a few, there's the Pacific Sail & Powerboat Show May 4-7 being held at Westpoint Harbor in Redwood City (see page 3 for more info), Mother's Day (don't forget yours on May 14), National Maritime Day (May 22), and Memorial Day (May 29). Practically something to do each weekend if you plan it right!

May is also when I have traditionally thought of boating season starting. Generally, Memorial Day weekend marks that unofficial start to the summer boating season. Along with that start of season, it is also when most people start thinking about getting ready to head out on the open water. Before you head out, below are some general items for boat maintenance and safety you and your crew will want to keep in mind as you prepare to head out for a day of fun in the sun:

- Impellers are what flow raw water through the heat exchanger of your engine's closed cooling system, or through the engine directly to keep things running at a normal operating temp. It is recommended to replace at least once every other season, or around 50-100 hours of use; whichever comes first.
- Ensure your distress flares are up to date. Or, if you don't want to deal with flares, perhaps consider looking at the Sirius Signal Light (or similar) in conjunction with a daytime distress flag. You don't have to deal with pyrotechnics and you won't have to worry about finding a location to dispose of the old expired flares.



- ♦ Basic lead acid batteries require maintenance too. After a long winter slumber of sitting on a maintenance charger, a battery may have dissipated some of its water content and may need to be topped off with distilled water. Be sure to check those levels and the battery purchase date. A battery older than 4-5 years can start to show signs of low voltage retention and or a slow crank on the engine when starting. Replace it before heading out if needed—it's very hard to push start a boat out on the water! lol
- Check your bilges and bilge pumps. Float switches are notorious for failing from either frequent use, or the lack thereof. And it's that simple little switch that can make a difference in keeping the floors dry, or getting to watch your ice chest float on the floorboards.
- ◆ Lastly, but definitely not least, make sure you have plenty of PFD's (personal floatation devices) onboard for you and each of your passengers.

For other safety reminders and good practices while underway, make sure to review the ABC's of California Boating handbook. This book will not only discuss what all is required to be onboard your boat in case of a boarding by authorities, but it will also provide good practices to help ensure you make it back to the dock safely.



Until next time, get working on those items needing attention aboard your boat, and I will hopefully see you all out on the water having a great time soon!


