In the ebb and flood of life, let's change tides to some marina items:

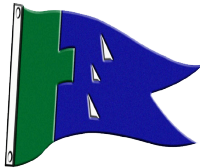
- ◆ We need everyone's help in doing the proper thing with garbage and recyclables. Too much trash and cardboard is being put in the recycle bins. Please, put your trash in the garbage cans (inside wood bins at the head of each dock), cardboard along side of the wood bins (for the time being), and soiled cardboard/paper products in the green waste bins near the dumpsters by Dock 1 and 4 parking lots. You will also see wire bins between the garbage cans at the head of each dock to be used for clean, broken down cardboard. We appreciate your help and cooperation.
- ◆ Reminder, DO NOT hold open the gate, or bathroom door, for anyone you are not positive as having a boat here in the marina. Everyone who belongs here has a key fob to access where they are allowed. We want to make sure our facilities continue to stay clean and safe for your use and enjoyment.
- ◆ While we enjoy seeing everyone using their boats and spending more time on the water, please remember you are only allowed per your slip license agreement to stay aboard your vessel 3 nights in a 7 day time period. If your situation has changed, or is potentially changing, and living aboard is an option you wish to explore, please contact our office for the proper method and details of how you might be eligible.
- ◆ We are quickly approaching the wet and windy season again, which means it's a wonderful time to take the opportunity to check your lines, make sure your hatches and windows are sealed, bilge pumps work, and your cord is properly routed to stay out of the water when the boat shifts in the slip. If you see someone's boat needing attention, please call the office to give us a heads up; extra eyes help.



If we don't get a chance to see you around the docks here soon, the Marina Team and I, hope you and your family are staying healthy and enjoy the upcoming holidays!

A special announcement from SPYC:

Greetings Sierra Point Marina Boaters:

The Sierra Point Yacht Club continues to monitor and follow San Mateo County Guidelines for opening during the Coronavirus Pandemic. As of August we are following the guidelines from July 13, 2020. We have sought guidance from Brisbane who enforce the guidelines and remain open for members only to use within the rules.

It has come to our attention that some boat owners in the marina have questions about activities at the club. SPYC has an Officer of the Day board and any time there are members in the Club questions should be addressed to that individual. Dylan Garrett and Martin Tali, our Commodore and Vice Commodore are also available to respond to any concerns.

Members are able to dine on the deck and have bar service with food. Individuals who are in pods and isolating together in groups up to 12 can sit closer than 6 feet apart on the deck. They must wear masks if anyone else is present outside when they are not eating or drinking. Others not in a pod must maintain six feet social distancing and wear masks when not eating or drinking.

We have asked all our members to work with us on continued education of safe practices at the club. We have increased our surface cleaning and have cleaning supplies and hand sanitizer available. We are accepting new members and if you are interested in joining please sign up on the SPYC Web Site.
