Are your feet wet, or your hat missing? Possibly both following the atmospheric river and gale wind event finishing off the end of October. It does however go to show all of us what wasn't thoroughly tied down, or didn't work properly aboard, disappeared to Davey Jones locker or reared its ugly head!

However, like many storms, we received calls to boats that were filling up with water, sails that came unfurled, and dock lines that stretched or flat out broke (among other items that went sideways—literally). I know I sound like a broken record, but I'll say it again, take a moment to stop in and check on your boat. I don't want one of our calls to be about a short mast or a radar unit turned sonar.

Storms and other weather events aside, we do have a different kind of event to look forward to! Yes, Thanksgiving Day, with all that turkey, mashed potatoes, stuffing, rolls, pumpkin and chocolate cream pies, and many other tasty things to devour.

Blowing over to marina items:

- Contact info: If you have a change of email, phone number or mailing address, please make sure to update our office in a timely fashion. Keeping your information current with our office is not only required, but it saves time in the need of contacting you in the event of an emergency.
- ♦ Check your bilges—after the first significant rain in many months, check the inside of your boat, and your bilges for any water that may have found its way inside your boat. Take note of any oily sheen in the bilge or fuel odors that may be present when you board your boat. If there's any fuel/oil sheens in the bilge, immediately turn off your bilge pump and take the necessary measures to properly remove contaminants from the bilge before restoring power to your bilge pump (s).
- Please make sure your dock box lid is secured with a lock on the hasp, or a marina supplied piece of wire to ensure the lid does not fly open and remove itself in a wind event. If the lid does break off and disappear, we do not have replacement lids to replace/repair. Please help us in preserving our dock boxes.
- ♦ Electricity be can be a shocking experience. It likes to travel the path of least resistance, and will strike out when one is least thinking about it. So we need to make sure we treat it with respect each and every time we handle it. I know the following sounds like common sense, but it's daunting how many times I see it: Turn off the breaker at your dock box before you unplug the cord from the dock or your boat; any load aboard drawing current may cause arcing within your plug and/or receptacle when pulled apart. Do not leave the breaker turned on any time the cord is not plugged into your boat. And lastly, do not allow your cord to drape through the water. Any abrasions or openings in your cord jacket may allow water penetration and electrical current to leak out into the surrounding water.
- Weather changes daily—please check your boat frequently.
