Trick or Treat

Changing of tides, tightening of lines, the docks start to creak, and the buoy markers chime. The day begins to fade and the night grows dark, the winds calm down, and it becomes very stark. Fog forms low, the moon sits high, and off in the distance, ships lay idle under the dimly lit sky. Chill settles in, frost biting at your neck, but you don't dare look at what's creeping on deck. Now pitch black as the waves start to roll, here he comes as the bells toll. BOO...hope you have a Spooktacular Halloween!

The days have definitely become much shorter as we have dipped into fall and heading towards winter. With night settling in earlier each day, our maintenance team and I try to make sure all lights are functioning regularly. However, please let us know if you happen to spot any lights along the Bay Trail, dock, or otherwise that may not be lit. We welcome additional eyes as we try to make sure things stay safe and enjoyable for everyone!

Additional news, effective October 6, 2021, the Brisbane Police Department has assigned Officer Jason Quan to the Brisbane Marina and Sierra Point area. Jason will be working 12-hour shifts, rotating periodically between nights and days. When you see him on the docks or in the parking lot area, please welcome him to our community.

Staying on with safety items, please review the following reminders as we roll into wet and windy months ahead:

- ◆ Dock lines, which are appropriately sized for your vessel, are important and help ensure your vessel remains safely tied to the dock during high winds and other weather events. Please make sure your lines are in good condition, and take a moment to stop by after any weather events to check and make any necessary adjustments; lines stretch frequently.
- ◆ Now's the time to verify all your window seals, drains and scuppers are good to go before the weather changes. Make sure there's no debris that will wash down your gunwale or cockpit drains and cause a plug or backup of excess water.
- ◆ Bilge pumps and thru-hulls: make sure all your bilge pumps work appropriately, and the float switches are not obstructed. It's recommended to close thru-hulls that are not in use while you are away for any extended period of time, and in addition, exercise your thru-hulls once a month to help prevent seizing or other operational issues. While performing the above, it is a good time to put eyes on your bilge to check if anything else is happening that may need to be addressed.
- ◆ We strongly suggest you do not leave your shore side hose turned on and connected to your vessel water system when the boat is unattended. The dock water supply has the capacity/pressure to potentially overrun bilge pump(s) or dewatering devices if an issue were to arise when you're not aboard.
- ◆ Do not hold open the door or gate for anyone you are not 100% sure belongs within the marina. If the person belongs, they will have a proper method of entry on their own. And if you see something strange, please report it to our office or after hours to the non-emergency line of Brisbane Police at (415) 467-1212.
