Honorable Chairman Gooding, Honorable Vice-Chairman Patel, Honorable Commissioners With Copy to Staff.

I support the Jimenez family in their application for Grading Permit 2021-EX-3, in the pursuit of the development of their property located at 296 San Benito Road.

According to the staff report, I observe that the design developed by Mr. Jim Trotter, Architect "complies with all applicable development standards". On the grading permit application in particular, I note the grading required to develop the project "is minimized and designed to reflect or fit comfortably with the natural topography", and "designed to avoid large exposed retaining walls". As well, "this grading review application has been reviewed by the City Engineer/Department of Public Works, Building Department and North County Fire Authority and there were no exceptions or comments". With all applicable findings met, and no mention of any derogation from any requirement, I for one see no reason to deny this application, and many reasons to support it.

First, this project will replace the existing structure with a new home for the Jimenez family, one that combines the benefits of better suiting their needs, rectifying a number of existing non-conformances found in the current circa-1932 structure and, not least, bringing another beautiful home into our community. Everybody wins.

Second, after a years-long effort to make this project come to fruition (despite a number of challenges), seeing Mr. Trotter involved is another indication of the steadfast commitment of the Jimenez family to invest in Brisbane. I know Mr. Trotter's work first-hand: he designed our own residence, and I recognize in the Jimenez project design's his ability to create "form in the service of function", with style. Brisbane will benefit in having yet another Trotter-designed home, something that the immediate neighbors and the community at large will benefit from.

Third, three generations of this long-time Brisbane family call Brisbane home, and this project is the single biggest investment of Paul and Glenda's life – one that makes efficient use of a very small lot in the service of a young local family and one that will bring economic activity to our fair city.

Last, as stated in its Housing Element, Brisbane must "plan for the housing needs of all economic segments of the City's population, in balance with land-use, environmental and the other goals set forth in the other

General Plan elements". Approving this project will be a very direct and concrete way to put Brisbane's plan into action.

I hope you give the Jimenez family the support they need in making the Brisbane General Plan satisfy *their* housing needs, by approving this application in support of their project.
