PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

E. Review RFP Samples and Begin Framing Key Components of a Public Arts Master Plan RFP for Brisbane

The Committee reviewed RFPs from City of Alameda, City of Belmont, City of Redwood City (RWC) and City of South San Francisco (SSF). They highlighted their preferences from each city's RFP:

- Belmont the conciseness of their RFP, their key elements section and consultant selection section (with modifications);
- SSF their timeline, public participation plan and overarching goals (community involvement, diversity of art and a sense of place, but not "artist's participation" as this is not part of the Master Plan);
- RWC the qualifications section and submittal requirements;
- Alameda's RFP was too long and "wordy", they didn't like their submittal requirements or selection process.

Aside from the elements listed above, the Committee wants the RFP to include these elements:

- Language about "art on loan" and temporary art;
- Large focus on a robust public outreach;
- Recommendations for language around collection, ownership & maintenance of art;
- Consultant to understand that Brisbane has large developments on the horizon that need to be considered (Baylands and Sierra Point Parkway).
- F. Discuss Approach for Identifying Project Fee Structures

The Committee reviewed the costs from the other cities: Belmont - \$25K; RWC - \$60K; SSF - \$80K; and Alameda \$60.

After much discussion, the Committee would like to propose the RFP state their budget as "not to exceed \$75K".

Staff will draft an RFP and bring it back to the Committee at the next meeting.

G. Consider Ideas for Small Interim Projects

The Committee brainstormed various project ideas and "low-hanging fruit" projects. Some ideas are:

- Exhibit space to display temporary art (aside from city hall's large conference room);
- Decorative mailboxes for community involvement (mailboss.com);
- Sidewalk Chalk Art Event;
- Firth Park: refresh the Helix and Turtle sculptures;
- Film Festival (potentially a children's/young adult);
- Surprise Art pieces throughout town;
- And a Bench Art project this may be a larger project. Link is to City of Chico's project:
